"FIVE LITTLE DUCKS" (KIDS SONG)



Welcome to School To Go and today's lesson!

This is a lesson in the subject of "English" about "The Ocean" in three episodes, with the three themes: ""Five little Ducks-song", "Baby Shark-Song" and finally "The fish song". There will be both listening texts and exercises in the episodes.

Introduction

Today, we're going to explore a fun and heartwarming song called "Five Little Ducks." This song tells the story of five little ducks who go on an adventure but don't all come back right away. It's a song about family, numbers, and the fun of being out in nature. As we listen, we'll learn about counting and the special bond between a mother duck and her ducklings. Learning Objectives

By the end of our lesson, you will be able to:

- 1. Understand and repeat 10 new English words from the song "Five Little Ducks."
- 2. Use simple sentences to describe the story of the ducks (e.g., "The little ducks come back to Mama.")
- 3. Visualize the ducks' adventure and how they return to their mother while listening to the song.

Before We Start, Let's Hear a Cozy Story

To get us ready for the song, let's hear a cozy story about some playful little ducks. This story will help you understand more about ducks and their adventures by the pond.

A story - The Adventurous Little Ducks

Once upon a time, there were five little ducks who lived by a peaceful pond with their Mama Duck. The little ducks were always full of energy, splashing in the water, diving under the surface, and waddling around the pond. They loved exploring and finding new things to play with.

Let's Listen Together

As you listen, imagine the ducks waddling away from the pond and Mama Duck calling them back. Picture the ducks exploring the fields and then returning to their mother. Just relax, listen to the song, and enjoy picturing the little ducks and their fun adventures.

Now listen to the lyrics without music, and if possible, read together with me:

But only four little ducks came back.

Three little ducks went out one day Over the hills and far away Mama Duck said "quack, quack, quack" But only two little ducks came back.

Two little ducks went out one day
Over the hills and far away
Mama Duck said "quack, quack, quack"
But only one little duck came back.

One little duck went out one day
Over the hills and far away
Mama Duck said "quack, quack, quack"
But none of the little ducks came back.

Sad Mama Duck went out one day
Over the hills and far away
Mama Duck said "quack, quack, quack"
And all of the five little ducks came back!

Now Let's Learn Some New Words

Before we hear the song with music, here are 10 new words to help you understand the song better. Listen closely and repeat after me:

- 1. Duck
- 2. Pond
- 3. Quack
- 4. Hill
- 5. Away
- 6. Come back
- 7. Mama
- 8. Day
- 9. Little
- 10. Five

Great job! Now you're ready for the song.

Just Listen and Enjoy the Song and Music

Let's listen to "Five Little Ducks." As you listen, focus on the words and the story of the ducks going on their adventure. Picture the ducks waddling away and then returning to Mama Duck. There's no need to sing or move—just relax, listen carefully, and enjoy imagining the ducks' day by the pond.

After the Song

Now that we've listened to the song, let's review the 10 new words we learned. Think about what they mean in your language and how we used them in the song:

- 1. Duck a bird that swims and quacks
- 2. Pond a small body of water
- 3. Quack the sound a duck makes
- 4. Hill a small, raised area of land
- 5. Away to go far from somewhere
- 6. Come back to return

- 7. Mama your mother
- 8. Day the time when the sun is out
- 9. Little small in size
- 10. Five the number 5

Now it's time to complete a few tasks and reflect on what we've just learned.

Work tasks

- 1. Drawing Task: Draw a picture of the five little ducks by the pond. Label your drawing with English words like "duck," "pond," and "hill."
- 2. Writing Task: Write a short sentence about the ducks. You can say something like, "The ducks go out to play."
- 3. Story Task: Imagine the five little ducks go on another adventure. Write or draw a short story about what the ducks do next when they go out.

Once you have completed the tasks, this episode will end.

Here starts the ideas for teachers:

Ideas for the teacher

- 1. Use Visual Aids: Show pictures of ducks, ponds, and hills to help students visualize the setting of the song. This helps students connect the words with the images.
- Vocabulary Matching Game: Play a game where students match pictures of ducks, ponds, and other things from the song with the new words they've learned.
- 3. Drawing Activity: Ask students to draw their favorite part of the song. Was it when the ducks went over the hill, or when they came back to Mama Duck? Let them use the new vocabulary to describe their drawings.
